The following communication was received by the Secretariat on 5 February 1997 along with a request for its circulation to Members of the Committee on Agriculture.

In accordance with the procedures at the time, Part IV of South Africa's Schedule refers to the document G/AG/AGST/ZAF and, specifically, to Tables 6 and 6(bis). On review, it appears that these tables were inadvertently not included in that document dated 22 March 1995.

These tables and relevant additional tables relating to South Africa's domestic support calculations are set out below in the interest of transparency and completeness. South Africa is at Members' disposal should there be any need to clarify the information.
