SCHEDULE XVIII - SOUTH AFRICA

WHEREAS the CONTRACTING PARTIES to the General Agreement on Tariffs and Trade 1947 adopted, on 26 March 1980, a Decision on Procedures for Modification and Rectification of Schedules of Tariff Concessions (BISD 27S/25);

WHEREAS in accordance with the provisions of the above-mentioned Decision, a draft containing modifications and rectifications to Schedule **XVIII** - **South Africa** was communicated to all Members of the World Trade Organization in document G/MA/TAR/RS/422 on 9 September 2015, and no objections to the proposed modifications and rectifications were received within three months from the date of issue of the aforementioned document;

IT IS HEREBY CERTIFIED that the modifications and rectifications to Schedule **XVIII** - **South Africa** are established in conformity with the above-mentioned Decision.
